

Speak Out Against Lies

At the November 2 Westerly School Committee meeting a private citizen accused ARC of holding secret meetings with the members of the Town Council and School Committee in 2020 and 2021, claiming that this violated the Open Meetings Act. Although he has brought this up before and was told that no violation occurred, he continues to pursue this claim and accused Leslie Dunn and Kevin Lowther of misleading the public. Both Leslie and Kevin are candidates for School Committee and Town Council, respectively. You can see this exchange on the Westerly Schools Facebook page at 3:14:40 in the recording. In the face of outright lies regarding Westerly ARC, as well as attacks on two candidates and others who are ARC members, it is important to defend the truth. Your presence and involvement is an important way to show our elected officials that creating a more equitable and inclusive town and school system must always be a priority.






