# Westerly ARC Mourns the Loss of Mike Kelly

It is with a heavy heart that we share with you the passing of our good friend and ARC advocate Michael Kelly. Mike joined our Sunday rallies the summer of George Flloyd's murder. He came religiously every week to stand with us holding his

multi-colored sign that announced

that all people, black, brown, gay, straight, women and men deserved dignity and respect. He was friendly and kind with a great thirst for racial justice.

Mike lost his year and a half battle with cancer while living with his family in Connecticut. His daughter, Jes, reminded us how much our group and the friends he made here meant to him. We hope you will join us in giving thanks for Mike's life and witness. His family plans to hold a memorial service in late winter or early spring in Westerly.
