Last Week's Protest

On Sunday, November 27 many ARC participants joined with people across the country to pay tribute to the victims of the recent mass shooting in Colorado Springs at the Club Q nightclub. The names of the five people killed were read while candles were lit. The memorial ceremony reminded those gathered that it was 44 years ago when Harvey Milk, the first openly gay man to be elected to public office in California, was assassinated. On this Day of Rememberance, the names of the 49 people massacred at the Pulse gay nightclub in Orlando, Florida in 2016 were also read.

We offered this Sunday vigil in support of LGBTQ2S+* people in our community. It is important that they know that we do not tolerate bias-motivated crimes in our country and that we support all communities that have been maligned, harassed, intimidated and abused.

Violinist Kevin "Big Lux" Lowther played the James Taylor song "Fire and Rain" which includes beautiful, poignant and fitting lyrics (``I Always Thought I'd See you Again").

* 2S (Two-Spirit) is an umbrella term used by some Indigenous North Americans to describe Native people in their communities who fulfill a traditional third-gender role in their cultures. It is with a heavy heart that we share with you the passing of our good friend and ARC advocate Michael Kelly. Mike joined our Sunday rallies the summer of George Flloyd's murder. He came religiously every week to stand with us holding his multi-colored sign that announced that all people, black, brown, gay,

straight, women and men deserved dignity and respect. He was friendly and kind with a great thirst for racial justice.

Mike lost his year and a half battle with cancer while living with his family in Connecticut. His daughter, Jes, reminded us how much our group and the friends he made here meant to him. We hope you will join us in giving thanks for Mike's life and witness. His family plans to hold a memorial service in late winter or early spring in Westerly.




Swearing-In Ceremony


Join Voices of Hope and the Jewish Book Council for our December Power of Words Series program with Tova Friedman, author of *Daughter of*

December 1 World AIDS Day

World AIDS Day is an opportunity for people worldwide to unite in the fight against HIV, to show support for people living with HIV, and to commemorate those who have died from an AIDS-related illness. About 38



million people are living with AIDS today and 35 million have died of HIV or AIDS related illnesses.

December 3 International Day of Persons with Disabilities

The International Day of Persons with Disabilities aims to promote an understanding of disability issues and mobilize support for the dignity, rights and well-being of persons with disabilities. This year's theme is "Transformative solutions for inclusive development: the role of innovation in fueling an accessible and equitable world."

December 10 International Human Rights Day

The <u>Universal Declaration of Human Rights</u> was adopted by the United Nations General Assembly in 1948. The most translated document in the world, it proclaims the inalienable rights that everyone is entitled to as a human being – regardless of race, colour, religion, sex, language, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status.
