LAST SUNDAY'S PROTEST

At our weekly protest last Sunday, several candidates for local office stopped by to introduce themselves and to gather signatures for their campaigns. An active, well-informed citizenry is the backbone of any true democracy; ARC is happy to provide a positive space for all who want to share their platforms and priorities with us. We are proud our Sunday ARC community has become a focal point of our Westerly community.

We encourage everyone to become familiar with the issues and the positions of all candidates. We will provide opportunities to register to vote, as well as information on how and when to exercise this essential right. Most importantly, we will help the ARC community learn about the candidates.

THIS SUNDAY'S PROTEST

Please join us this Sunday, July 17, for our weekly peaceful protest for equality and justice for our Black, Brown and Indiginous communities. While ARC originally formed to stand strong for anti-racism, racism casts a shadow over all other human rights and freedoms - women's and LGBTQ+ rights, environmental devastation, even war - all prevent people from realizing their freedom and our country from making progress. Join us and bring signs and banners expressing your concerns. Please be mindful that our rallies are family friendly and so we ask that your signs and posters be respectful to each other and to the children in attendance.

Make sure you are registered to vote. If you can, volunteer your time or donate money to candidates who share your goals and values. Join the League of Women Voters of South County to get informed and take an active part in government. See https://www.lwv.org/local-leagues/lwv-south-county. Democracy doesn't just happen: it is the direct result of citizen participation. Let your voice be heard, join us on the Westerly Post Office steps every Sunday, rain or shine, from 11:00am-1:00pm. We encourage you to speak at one of our gatherings. The crowd is welcoming and we appreciate all our presenters. Read a poem, share a story, perform a dance or sing a song. The floor is yours!

Some topics we hope to discuss in the coming weeks include: banning books, incarceration, voting and voter information, candidates forum, policing, and a Hiroshima/Nagasaki remembrance on Aug 6. EDUCATE, EMBRACE AND EMPOWER - WE NEED YOUR HELP

We need a large turnout for the July 19 Planning Board Meeting. On the agenda: The use and development of the St. Pius property, at Elm and School Streets. A proposal for mixed housing is on the table. We urge all to attend and speak out about the critical need for affordable housing. Many voices strongly oppose this proposal. It is imperative that our side be seen and heard. The meeting is from 6:00-9:00pm.

As background, St Pius is being developed as potentially a three- phase project. One phase is a renovation of the current school building, one phase potentially adds a single family home and multi family home to the Elm St. side of the property and the most contentious part adds a multifamily apartment building behind the current St. Pious building. This meeting will be heavily attended by neighborhood residents against this project - concerned about traffic, aesthetics, utilities burden, stormwater management, character, and massing (size of the building frontage). There will likely be references to "upstate or out of town interests" and immigrants cramming into the apartments. But Westerly needs this project:

- The town of Westerly is drastically short of its target of 10% affordable housing. This is housing badly needed to attract families and workers.
- This adaptive reuse of the existing St.Pious building will help preserve the neighborhood's character.
- The neighborhood already has extremely large apartments (the Elms, Windsor Condos) and another multifamily project would not be out of scale.
- Some portion of this housing will be affordable housing, for 80% of the area median income. A family of four making under \$75,000 qualifies, for example.
- The current zoning supports this level of density.
- We are building in a place where it is not necessary to clear natural habitat/

We hope to see as many people as possible at the meeting!
