

This Week: Honoring Martin Luther King, Jr.

We will take time this week to honor the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The music of **Geoff Kaufman** will help us to reflect on this important day. There will also be an opportunity to participate in an activity using quotes from Dr. King.

Last Week

What an honor it was to listen to and learn from **Asa Peters**, our guest speaker last week. Asa, a research associate and member of the Mashpee Wampanoag tribe, spoke of the violence that has repeatedly been "seared in" to the American story since the 1600s. Asa provided many examples, such as the violence of Bacon's Rebellion, which led to the strengthening of a race-based caste system in order to keep white indentured servants from aligning with Blacks who were enslaved. The othering of Native Americans in imagery of the time, the exploitation of immigrants throughout our nation's history, the violent ideology of the US military, and the dehumanization of "enemies" are further examples that Asa expounded upon.

After a captivating look at this history, Asa concluded by relating the ideas he presented to our work at Westerly ARC. He offered a four-hundred-year perspective of the importance of fighting for justice for all and how justice cannot be compartmentalized for specific groups or in certain places. Those in attendance last week are sure to be reflecting on Asa's words for some time. We are grateful for his visit and look forward to seeing him in Westerly again.

Letter from Birmingham Jail

On Tuesday, January 10, about forty people gathered at the Westerly Library to listen to Dr. Martin Luther King's "<u>Letter from Birmingham Jail</u>" read aloud. It was written as a response to eight white religious leaders who criticized Dr. King for participating in peaceful protests in April of 1963. It was moving to sit and



listen to the stirring words which are just as applicable today as they were sixty years ago. Thank you to Westerly Area Peace and Justice and Pam McDonald for organizing this event.

I have almost reached the regrettable conclusion that the Negro's great stumbling block in his stride toward freedom is not the White Citizen's Counciler or the Ku Klux Klanner, but the white moderate, who is more devoted to "order" than to justice; who prefers a negative peace which is the absence of tension to a positive peace which is the presence of justice; who constantly says: "I agree with you in the goal you seek, but I cannot agree with your methods of direct action." (Letter from Birmingham Jail)



<u>January 16</u> – Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day

Every third Monday of January, the United States observes a holiday to honor the life and legacy of Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. In 1994



Congress passed a bill to dedicate the national holiday as a national day of service. The King Holiday and Service Act was introduced by Congressman John Lewis and Senator Harris Wofford, both of whom had worked alongside Dr. King in civil rights activism. Since then, it has become a day to remember Dr. King's work and, as importantly, to continue on the path towards justice he paved for us. (PBS)

January 17 – National Day of Racial Healing

Racial healing restores individuals and communities to wholeness. Racial healing repairs the damage caused by racism. It facilitates trust, builds authentic relationships and bridges divides.Racial healing is at the heart of racial equity – the people work that leads to community, organizational and systems transformation.
